She attended Enterprise Rural School 4 I/2 miles west of Odell and graduated from Odell High School in 1938.

Dorothy taught school for 6 years and then married Paul Schramm in 1945 and they worked together on the farm northwest of Odell. Dorothy really enjoyed working with the dairy.

After Paul's death, Dorothy moved into Odell where she lived for the next 32 years.

Four and 1/2 years ago, she moved to Fairbury and since June 1st she has resided at Gardenside LTC in Fairbury. She likes Gardensideespecially the food.

Paul and Dorothy raised 3 children - Darrell, Larry, and Diane. They were taught to work hard and save money.

When asked what she likes best about Odell she summed it up as "THE BEST LITTLE TOWN IN NEBRASKA".

**Sophia Fuchs** (Fukes) Sophia Fuchs was born 8 miles south of Odell on September 1, 1921.

She attended Trinity Lutheran School for 8 years and helped her folks and others with canning, butchering, and house

cleaning.

She married Edgar Stohs in 1944 and they had 2 children, Leroy and Marlys. Edgar passed away in 1950 and after her children were through high school Sophia moved into Hanover. She worked for anyone that needed help and for one family she cleaned house and cooked for 38 years. She also worked at the Hanover Hospital. Sophia married Ernest Fuchs and after living in Hanover for 2 years they moved to Odell in 1974. Ernest worked at the Beatrice State Home (BSDC) and also at the Coop Elevator in Odell. He passed away in 1983.

Sophia has made a lot of quilts for her family and friends and continues to make quilts today for Lutheran World Relief.

renewed and will be 95 on Thursday -Happy Birthday Sophia!
