

<u>Diller-Odell Board of Education</u> <u>Minutes</u>

June 11, 2018 7:30 pm — Regular Meeting

Elementary Media Center—Diller

Members Present: Dean Engelman, Paul Kostal, Chad Lottman, Gary Stohs & Jill Scheele. Toni Landenberger (excused absence) Motion to approve minutes of last meeting by Dean Engelman. Second Paul Kostal. Passed with 5 yea, 0 nay.

Toni Landenberger arrived at the meeting at 7:40. Marc Munford of Ameritas presented information on a lease purchase for a gym addition project.

Consideration and adoption of a resolution authorizing the District to reimburse itself for certain capital expenditures out of the proceeds of tax-exempt obligations to be issued by or on behalf of the District. Motion made by Chad Lottman and seconded by Toni Landenberger. Passed with 6 yea, 0 nay

Mr. Mezger reported that 20 students attended Kindergarten Round-up. He gave an update on SRP (Standard Response Protocol), NDE reporting and the testing schedule for 2018-19.

The Board reviewed the policies of the Anti Bullying Policy #5054 and Multicultural Policy #6020.

Motion made to approve Alternative Edu-

cation Agreement by Jill Scheele and seconded by Dean Engelman. Passed with 6 yea and 0 nay. The District will continue to have 2 spots at the Alternative School. Superintendent Meyerle reported that Kaylie Snyder had been hired as a 7-12 Sped Para for 2018-19 to fill the open position.

Superintendent Meyerle noted summer facility projects that included window replacement, girls' restroom renovation, AC replacement, football press box update and renovation of the visitor football bleachers at the elementary.

At the HS, projects include flooring resurfacing in the locker rooms, steps to the stage, steps to the band room, the stage and an update on the SE parking lot.

Superintendent Meyerle noted that there would be required policy updates provided by KSB School Law to take action on at the July meeting. The Board will review the updates prior to July.

Lunch prices

for adults will be raised at the July meeting as required by NDE following a recent audit. Adult prices will change from \$3.25 to approximately \$3.60. We hope to keep student prices as they were in 2017-18.

There will be two hearings prior to the regular meeting on July 9. Student Frees and Parental Involvement.

Motion to approve bills as presented made by Toni Landenberger and seconded by Paul Kostal. Passed with 6 yea, 0 nay. Motion to adjourn meeting by Dean Engelman, 2nd by Jill Scheele. Passed, 6 yea, 0 nay. Meeting adjourned at 9:05 pm. Next regular meeting is July 9, 2018 @ 7:30 pm. There will be a hearing on Student Fees at 7:20 pm and a hearing on Parental Involvement at 7:25 pm.





The Diller-Odell Spanish Club made their trip to Mexico May 24-31, 2018. 13 students and 3 adult sponsors arrived in Merida, Mexico (after a slight airline/airport delay) on May 25, 2018. While in Mexico the group was able to serve at an orphanage in Marida, where they interacted with the kids and put their Spanish skills to use with coloring and sticker books. They also polished the girls' nails. The kids at the orphanage really enjoyed checking out the students' phones. They played games and took pictures with the Snapchat filters.

The group then travelled to visit a Mayan family in Santa Elena. The Zamora family showed the group aspects of their daily lives, including making 150 corn tortillas by hand, extracting plat fibers to make rope and how to sleep in a hammock!

The group then travelled to Uxmal where they explored the Mayan ruins, learned about Mayan pyramids, ball courts, architecture and religious beliefs. They even climbed the 74 stairs to the top of one of the pyramids! That evening they attended a festival of crafts, food and dancing.

On the groups' 3rd day in Mexico they went to the ancient city of Chichen Itza. Their tour guide, Ricardo, educated them on the ancient city's history. Following



this they were able to go to a beautiful underground natural lake with a waterfall where they "cliff jumped" and swam. It was a fun and educational day!

The next day they went to Xelha, a tropical eco park water resort where they got in a bit of relaxing. While staying at the resort, they were able to visit a replica of a Mayan village and Mexican cemetery. They experienced a 2 hour show that included Mayan Ball games, a dramatization of Mexico's history and famous dances from Mexico.

The group had a "free day" the next day and got to choose either deep sea fishing or para sailing. That evening they ate at a

"fancy" restaurant, Hacienda Don Diego and had a four course meal.

It was an amazing experience for these kids. Thank you for everyone's support at all of their fundraisers to make this trip happen!
