


Rice Lodge & Conference Center, Odell, Nebraska IT IS FINISHED! The hidden-

Diller-Odell Board of Ed Minutes High School Media Center Odell Monday, November 12, 2018 7:30 pm—Regular Board Mtg. Members Present: Paul Kostal, Chad

Lottman, Gary Stohs, Dean Engelman & Toni Landenberger. Jill Scheele's absence excused.

Motion to approve minutes of last meeting was made by Paul Kostal and seconded by Toni Landenberger. Motion passed with 5 yea and 0 nay.

Skylar Pretzer & Korey Theye informed the Board of recent student activities.

Mr. Mezger was not in attendance, but provided the Board a written report. In his report he had first quarter Honor Roll achievements. He also noted the 2018-19 student enrollment number which is 255, PreK-12. The enrollment is steady. He also reported the 2018-19 poverty trend in the District which is down. The Board discussed the possibility of a Gage County SRO (Security Resource Officer). Although the Board sees the role as very beneficial, especially in the area of building positive relationships, the Board has concerns over the time the officer would be in our building and the fact that the officer would not serve the elementary school since it is in Jefferson County. The estimated cost to our district would be approximately \$23,000.

Mr. Mezger noted in a report that digital citizenship is a technology goal of the district.

Superintendent Meyerle noted that he will have monthly meetings with the Caspers/Sampson reps on the status of the new gym. They met on November 6, and feel they are on schedule. The frame of the building may begin going up November 14.

Closed or Open Minded? Which one do you consider yourself? OR is it really hard to judge what you are? When we are narrow, or closed minded, how do we know? Here are some tendencies of narrow minded people (I know it's very negative! When I read these I tried to be positive, so I could look within myself and make some changes!)

- The "know it all": Do you already know "everything" and are always the first to answer anything and think you have all the answers already? An open minded person is willing to listen to others and admit they don't have all the answers or "know it all" and are willing to learn new things.
- Easy to Pass Judgement: Do you pass judgement quickly and without considering someone's "story"? Narrow minded people judge quickly and point fingers in public and tend to follow stereotypes. To some degree, we all judge people, but open-minded people tend to "catch" when they are doing this and adjust, and know when to stop!
- Deeply Habitual: Habits and routine are good for everyone. It's when these habits become obsessions does it affect us negatively. If you become too "habitual" it is bad for you both mentally and physically. So enjoy your "routines", but be willing to step

away from them and outside your comfort zone.

- 4. Tendency to "assume" everything: Narrow-minded people are pretty much OK with assuming everything. They assume things about oth- 7. ers without knowing the truth. They assume everyone else thinks as they do and has the same opinions. They assume "silly" things about themselves like "they don't like flying" or "they don't like storms" or "they don't like animals" without actually trying to step outside that assumption and actually know whether they do or not. They convince them selves of anything.
- Get Offended Easily: narrow 5. minded people tend to stick to their rigid values or things they have always thought because it is part of that "routine". They are unwilling to think outside the box or change their way of thinking or doing things. They are offended when others test these boundaries they have. They take offense to the littlest thing that is different for them. Open minded people are willing to learn new things and be able to change their values as they live their life, adjusting and growing as necessary.
- 6. **Xenophobia:** The fear of "Strange" things, but it can relate to anything for

a narrow minded person...age, race, religion, etc. They have a fear and tend to criticize anything, even if it will never affect them directly in their lives.

7. Having Trust Issues: This makes sense that a narrow minded person would have trust issues, since there is fears everywhere for them. They distrust anyone who is a bit different or outside their comfort zone with no basis for this distrust.

What did you decide? Are you Open or Closed? I'm assuming we all have a bit of each, but if you lean more heavily toward being close minded, the first step is that you realize it and are "open" to changing...even if it is tiny bit at a time. Trying new things, whether large or small, will help stimulate your mind to be open, learn about different people and lifestyles, listen to new music, do something outside your everyday routine, write more, do not stay idle, overcome your fears instead of being obsessed with them. Most of all, while opening your mind, open your heart along with it. Be open to each and every person as their own being created by God to be here to do good. With open-mindedness comes love and understanding and peace.
