## Rice Lodge & Conference Center, Odell, Nebraska

Happy New Year from the Rice Lodge & Conference Center, Bed & Breakfast, in Odell, Nebraska. The

Lodge continues to be a popular place for visitors. We had 470 rooms rented this year. That is up from 398 last year. We have 363 booked for 2019 as of now. Since we have opened in August 2012, visitors have used 2,257 rooms. From August 2012 to May 2015, we had 6 bedrooms. In May 2015, we opened the south wing and added 4 more rooms. This year, the Lodge has been home to quilting groups from Beatrice, Crete and York. The Ladies Retreat group from Lincoln made a couple repeat visits. There were also many families in for weddings, funerals, baptisms, birthdays, confirmations & graduations in the area. There were quite a lot of family reunions held at the Lodge. The Catfish Expo group returned for a couple visits this year. The hunting trio returned for their 6<sup>th</sup> year. A couple attorneys from New York City came for the night to do depositions. A group of scrap bookers came in for 3 days. They did amazing things.

This success would not be possible without the help of a few people: Daniel Craven and Hailey Rogers do all the cleaning between guests. Daniel also handles any bigger projects needing done at the Lodge. He built the display for the hidden stairway and its treasures. It is wonderful and gets many compliments. They also do check-ins and whatever else needs to be done. Janice Duntz does fantastic artwork

on the landscaping of the Lodge. Her expert horticultural knowledge is all volunteered and we love what she does. Larry Stanosheck does all the mowing and scooping snow. Nicole Vater mowed the lawn when Larry couldn't. Larry has been mowing this lawn since he was 10 years old. Dr. Rice paid him to do it way back when, but he has volunteered his time to do it ever since Dr. Rice left in the 1960s. Bonnie Kaller jumps when needed. She has helped clean and does a lot of the check-ins. Robin Stanosheck will do check-ins if needed. Shelly Eisele keeps the website in great order. Mark Billesbach is our go-to for electric issues such as fire detectors beeping or falling. He also helps when we have issues with any of the keys. Adams Plumbing has been great at keeping the heating and air going efficiently, and has also watched the water softener salt supply. Mary Jo (Gary) Bures does all the seasonal decorating. Zach Heble of Heble Spray Coatings stopped the water leaks by spray foam coating the entire roof. John Novotny finished the Skrabal Garden Wall and put in the white fence on the north side of the building this year. Bruce Vitosh and Gary Bures, the other two board members, help with anything whenever asked.

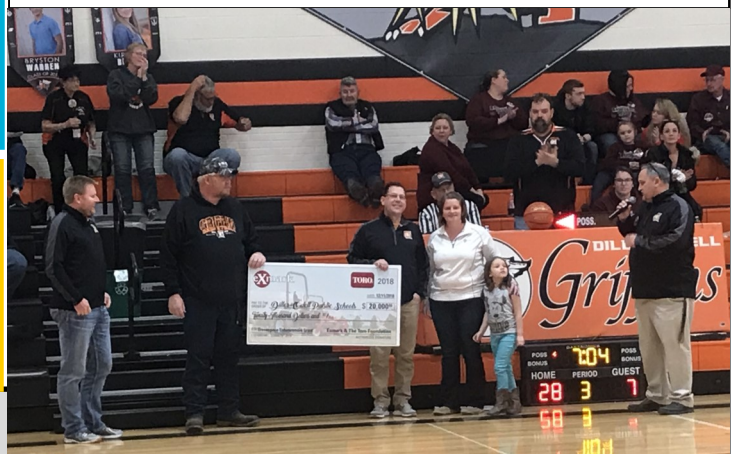

## Grant Received for New Gym Landscaping

## **For a Happier and Healthier Life, Stop Judging Others**

(this article is a good follow up to last month’s on being open minded)

I have wasted plenty of time and energy judging others. It has NEVER gotten me anywhere. What it has done is alter my own life and positivity. It made me irritable and angry, and jealous. It disturbed my focus. It took my peace away. If I had taken all my “judging” energy and put it into my life in a positive way, it would have done me some good.

Judging others, especially for things that do not concern you, only ever makes things worse. But how do you avoid judging? It just comes so naturally to us. We judge everyone, from a stranger we pass on the street, to a co-worker, to our political leaders, and usually we don’t have much info on them before we judge. Here are some steps you can take to avoid judging others and bring more positivity to

your life:

1. Judging others makes you lose friends: if you are a friend or have a friend who judges others around you without knowing them, soon you will find yourself without that friend. No one wants to be around someone who is always negative and complaining about something in their lives.
2. When you judge others, you can’t learn from them. We often judge others to make ourselves feel better. Is that good for you? NO. It is better to acknowledge someone else’s strengths, rather than their weaknesses. If you can see those strengths, you can learn from them. Everyone has something they do better than you (and vice versa), so see what that is and learn. Don’t compare yourself. You won’t gain any points when you “prove” yourself better than

someone, but you can better your life by learning from them. We tend to believe we know everything just after a couple experiences. We believe what we experienced has to be the same thing for everyone else. We believe we have earned the right to judge. There is a phenomena called the “Dunning-Kruger Effect”, where you develop an illusory superiority in your mind. You become overconfident in your abilities and think lowly of others. The important part of this is to remember to be humble. If you have learned so much from your own experiences, just imagine how much more you can learn from others!

3. Judging others damages your health and happiness. A study from UNL supports the belief that negative perceptions of others can boost narcissism and antisocial behavior. (page 8)

Korey Theye gave a report to the Board on recent student activities

Principal Mezger reported on the November 2 regional in-service, the State Principal's Conference, MAP Assessments, and the status of the 2017-18 Annual Report

Principal Mezger reported on the Civil Rights Data Collection, the Hour of Code at the elementary and plans for the Info Tech Night in August.

Superintendent Meyerle gave a report on the monthly meeting held with Caspers/Sampson personnel on the new

gym construction. Despite the wet weather that we did have, the builders feel good about their time table. The frame of the building will be going up on Dec. 5.

Superintendent Meyerle noted that the 2017-18 Annual Report should be ready by the end of the semester. He reminded the Board that the teacher's contract is settled for 2019-20. The base will increase from \$35,400 to \$35,950. The Board's negotiation team will meet in the fall to negotiate a contract for 2020-21. He also noted that he would like to discuss Mr. Mezger's salary in March.

Motion to approve bills as presented made by Jill Scheele and seconded by Toni Landenberger. Passed with 6 yea, 0 nay

Superintendent Meyerle's contract was reviewed. The contract runs until July 30, 2021. By not taking action to not renew the contract, the contract automatically rolls over for another year and will run until June 30, 2022.

Gary Stohs & Paul Kostal gave a report

on the recent NASB Conference in Omaha

Board Committee recommendations for 2019 were reviewed.

Superintendent Meyerle presented a plaque to Chad Lottman and Dean Engelman for their dedicated service to the Board. Chad has served on the Board since January 2003 and Dean since January 2007. Their service to the school district was very much appreciated. Angie Clifford and Adam Engelman will be sworn in as new Board members at the January Meeting.

Motion to adjourn meeting made by Chad Lottman and seconded by Dean Engelman. Motion passed with 6 yea and 0 nay.

Meeting adjourned by President Stohs at 8:03 pm

Next regular meeting is January 14, 2018 @ 7:30 pm at the High School Media Center in Odell.
