The Odell Public Library is in the process of raising \$1,300 to provide our local Library with a Makers Space!

What is a Makerspace?

A place in which people with shared interests in computing or technology, can gather to work on projects while sharing ideas, equipment, and knowledge.

What Would Our Library Have?

Because of our limited space, what our library will have is a Makerspace Cart. This will house items such as: STEM items and projects, Blocks, Brain Builders, Geometry, Geo Boards, Marble Set, Circuits, Magnets, Ozobots, Coding Mouse, Legos, Art & Craft Supplies. Kits that will be included are: Geology, Geometry. Magnet, Lever & Pulley, Magnetic Geometric Club, & Circuit. Games included will be: Gravity Marble, Color Matching, Thumbs Up, and Mental Critical Thinking Games. Our hope is to be able to offer programs for kids of all ages to come into the library and test their skills with different areas of interest. Once we raise the funding for this, we will "load the Makerspace Cart" up and start scheduling the programming at the Library! HELP IF YOU CAN!!



Diller Odell Board of Ed Minutes Elementary School Media Center Diller—Monday, April 8, 2019

7:30 pm—Regular Board Mtg. Members Present: Paul Kostal, Angie Clifford, Gary Stohs, Tony Landenberger Adam Engelman, & Jill Scheele. Motion to approve minutes of last meeting was made by Angie Clifford and seconded by Paul Kostal. Motion passed with 6 yea and 0 nay.

Skylar Pretzer and Korey Theye reported on recent student activities. Congratulations to students with their success in FFA, Speech, Golf and Track. Some students will be assisting with a local blood drive in Odell, April 10.

Principal Mezger reported on current enrollment numbers which are 253 in PK-12. In 2017-18 the number was 258 in March. He also noted that the ACT Test will be administered to all juniors on April 10. He reported that the text-book schedule had been updated for both the elementary and the high school.

Eric Hackler addressed the Board about use of the fitness centers for personal training of individuals. The Board will consider, but would have to update policy for the center to be used by anyone for profit, and also charge rent for the use. Mr. Hackler also stated he would be very interested in working with students that would want the assistance. This extra assistance would be similar to what some students do outside of school through the YMCA. The Board recognizes how this service would benefit residents. Superintendent Meyerle will research the possibility with legal counsel and insurance reps.

Motion to update Policy 3022 passed with a motion by Toni Landenberger and a second by Jill Scheele. Passed with 6 yea, 0 nay. Board updated Policy 3022 on Volunteers. The last statement in the policy is the update and reads: Volunteer Coaches will be assigned with the Head Coach making a request to the Activities Director and assigned with the approval of the Superintendent. No person shall be approved as a volun-

teer coach if the volunteer has children playing on the respective sports team that the coach would volunteer for.

The Board recognizes the success and popularity of the Nebraska Beef in Schools Program in other schools. Local beef would be donated and served at school lunch. Superintendent Meyerle will research the topic more and speak to the owners of the Diller Locker, and report back to the Board.

Re-elect certified staff with the exception of those who have resigned or have been given notice of non-renewal.

Passed with a motion by Paul Kostal and a second by Adam Engelman. 6 yea, 0 nay.

Motion to approve a classified wage increase of 3% for 2019-2020 made by Toni Landenberger and a second by Angie Clifford. Passed with 6 yea, 0 nay. The Board reviewed the Extra Duty assignments for 2019-2020

Superintendent Meyerle reported that an area of the parking lot at the elementary was recently paved. It is an area large enough for 26 cars. It will be a welcome improvement as the lot turns very muddy, and loads of rock over the years did not provide a long term solution. He also noted that the gym progress is on schedule, and that the front area remodel will begin as soon as school is out for the summer.

The Board discussed leasing two micro buses. With some routes getting smaller these buses that can carry a max of 14 passengers offer several positive options. No CDL is required, which will make it easier to find some drivers in the future. Also, in place of two small vehicles or a large bus, these small buses could make some activity trips. Superintendent Meyerle noted he would trade at least one of our higher mileage large buses. The Board will discuss again at the May meeting, and a rep will be there from Blue Bird Buses to answer questions.

The Board was receptive in paying Southern a per student cost for softball and golf. The Board is very appreciative

of the opportunity for Diller-Odell students to participate in those sports. They would ask that Diller-Odell be recognized as part of the team name with the NSAA

There was some discussion, per Superintendent Meyerle's request, on changing the age limit on the attendance at school functions such as Homecoming or Prom to allow no persons out of high school to attend. No changes will be made. The allowable age for outside dates will remain at 20 years or younger.

Motion to approve bills as presented made by Adam Engelman and seconded by Angie Clifford. Passed with 6 yea, 0 nay

Superintendent Meyerle, Principal Mezger, and the Board congratulated Gary Stohs for being named the Outstanding Board member from the state of Nebraska at the recent NRSCA conference. The award is a tribute to Gary's 22 years on the Board and the service to the school district.

Motion to adjourn the meeting was made by Toni Landenberger and a second by Adam Engelman. Motion passed with 6 yea, 0 nay.

Meeting adjourned by President Stohs at 9:02 pm

Next regular meeting is Monday, May 13th; 7:30 pm in the High School Media Center in Odell.
