What is Your Purpose?

The importance of having a purpose is in the headlines and on podcasts. It's the theme of sermons and the subject of self-help books—and for good reason. Studies show that those with a purpose live longer, sleep better, and have a more robust immune system, lower stress levels, and better cognitive function. One way a sense of purpose can lead to a longer life is because people with a sense of purpose tend to take better care of themselves through exercise, healthy eating, and addressing health issues when they arise.

Lower stress levels means less cortisol, a hormone that regulates the fight-or-flight response, is released into your system. High cortisol levels have been linked to anxiety, depression, weight gain, headaches, digestive problems, muscle tension, heart disease, high blood pressure, sleep issues, and concentration impairment. Lower cortisol production tends to make you less reactive and more resilient. So you bounce back when you're stressed rather than becoming overwhelmed. Helping others can pull you out of yourself, give you a different perspective and lead to connecting with others who share common interests.

Your "sense of purpose" does NOT have to be big or grand, At it's most basic, a sense of purpose directs your actions and behaviors. It's an abiding intention to achieve a long-term goal that's both personally meaningful and makes a positive mark on the world. A sense of purpose is often "other"-focused, something that can improve the lives of others, something bigger than yourself.

A sense of purpose is not a box you check off and move on. (more on pg. 10)

Monday, November 13, 2023

Regular Board Meeting—7:00 pm

Present: Adam Engelman, Paul Kostal, Kolin Kotas, Angie Clifford, Dusty Duis & Kasey Murphy.

Motion to approve minutes of last meeting made by Adam Engelman seconded by Kolin Kotas. Passed with 6 yea, 0 nay.

Ashley Duis presented a Student Report on recent activities that included a wrap up of Fall sports, FFA activities, a trip to the National FFA Convention. One Act play and basketball are underway.

Mrs. Robin Klaus, the district Art Teacher, presented a proposal on taking several students on an art field trip to Chicago April 17-19. The Art Club has funds to help finance the trip, with the students picking up any other cost. The Board was receptive and will formally approve the trip at the December meeting.

Principal Mezger gave an update on safety and security, which included the annual Safety Audit and enrollment numbers. A motion to play 6 man football in 2024 and 2025 was made by Adam Engelman and seconded by Kasey Murphy. Motion passed with 5 yea and 1 nay. Dusty Duis, nay, Angie Clifford, yea, Adam Engelman, yea, Paul Kostal, yea, Kolin Kotas, yea. Kasey Murphy, yea.

The Board had conversations with patrons the past month to help determine the decision. Superintendent Meyerle noted that things have changed in his time at the school. Meaning, schools, such as Thayer Central (Hebron), JCC (Tecumseh), Palmyra, and Southern all used to be 11 man schools, and now play 8 man football. Change has taken place state-wide where teams have moved down in classes.

Superintendent Meyerle noted that the change from 8 man to 6 man had been very positive for formal rivals Pawnee

City and Sterling. There seem to be fewer 8 man schools in southeast Nebraska, which was a topic of discussion on who may be on the schedule. Superintendent Meyerle reminded the Board the NSAA creates the football districts and the season schedules.

Superintendent Meyerle reported that some floor work would be done in Diller in an elementary restroom and the Art room over the winter break. Superintendent Meyerle reported that he was considering some staff reassignments for 2024-2025

He also noted Diller-Odell, Freeman, and Southern Schools will be sharing a resource (Law enforcement) officer in the coming months. Serving the three school districts is the job of the officer. They will not be pulled away for other duties in the County. Their schedule is to be determined. The program is funded by Gage County for the first year.

This officer will be serving not only our high school site, but will also be in the elementary in Diller, even though it is located in Jefferson County. After the first year, we would determine if we wanted to continue being part of the program, and how much service we wanted. If the County does not continue to fund the program, some of the cost would be our responsibility. The goal of this program is to build positive relationships with students and be a contact when such service is necessary with negative behavior or attendance.

A special thanks to Gage County for beginning this important service to assist in school security and safety.

Superintendent Meyerle also requested that the Board review the school's grade scales for 7-12. Compared to most ESU 5 schools, Diller-Odell's scale is much more difficult to achieve a 4.0 GPA. The school does not want to put the students at a disadvantage when it comes to scholarships, etc. The Board will further discuss the matter at the December meeting and may take action to change

the district's grade scale.

As an example, at some schools, a 90-93% is an A. At Diller-Odell, a 94-95% is an A-. Once a student has an A-, they cannot achieve a 4.0 GPA. One simple consideration is to make any grade of 94-100% as a grade of an A.

The Annual Financial Report was not available yet.

Motion to approve bills as presented made by Kasey Murphy and seconded by Angie Clifford. Motion passed with 6 yea and 0 nay.

Five Board members are set to attend the annual NASB conference in Omaha. Motion to renew JH football coop with Southern Public Schools made by Angie Clifford and seconded by Adam Engelman. Motion passed with 6 yea and 0 nay. The Board recognizes how the coop is a positive for the development of players and having well structured practices with competition for positions. The coop has been very positive and the Board's hope is that it continues.

Motion to renew high school softball cooperative with Southern Public Schools made by Adam Engelman and seconded by Kolin Kotas. Motion passed with 6 yea, 0 nay.

Motion to approve the Negotiated agreement with DOEA for 2024-2025 and 2025-2026 made by Kasey Murphy and seconded by Angie Clifford. Motion passed with 6 yea and 0 nay.

Superintendent Meyerle thanked the Board and teachers for their committee work, and appreciates how smooth the negotiation process is at the school. The Board conducted Superintendent Meyerle's annual evaluation.

Motion to adjourn made by Kasey Murphy and seconded by Adam Engelman. Passed with 6 yea, 0 nay.

President Kostal adjourned the meeting at 8:13 pm. The next regular meeting is scheduled for December 11, 2023 at 7:00 pm at the Elementary School in Diller.

Purpose cont'd

Happiness is a worthy goal—and one many people seem to be striving for. But, you won't achieve happiness simply by pursuing it for its own sake.

Why does Purpose matter so much?

1. **PURPOSE FOCUSES YOU:** It provides that point of focus in a chaotic world. We have so much information thrown at us each day, that attention has become very scarce. The focus on our purpose helps us push aside information that is unneeded and give attention to the things that matter
2. **PURPOSE GROUNDS YOU:** Purpose can give you the same sense of awe that you get when you look at a sunset or the crashing waves on a beach and you are impressed or inspired, or you hear a child laugh and you have hope. You might simply stop and chat with a teenager and make them feel seen, or you help someone who is upset find a solution and reduce their stress. To find happiness with a purpose, consider what matters in the bigger picture and how your role can make a difference to others.
3. **PURPOSE CONNECTS YOU:** Feeling socially disconnected is one of the fastest routes to depression, anxiety, and other mental health challenges. It is also a sure path to physical health challenges. People feel the greatest sense of purpose when their work matters to others. No matter if you are a teacher, a janitor, or work in the corporate world, if you feel your work is doing something to help others or help the world, you feel connected...connected to those you are working with, those you are helping, and the world. This is why you should also value the work of others around you. See what they are doing and acknowledge it—this will help their purpose.

How do you identify your purpose?

1. **Start with your values.** If you're not sure what your specific values are, download a list from the internet—there are many to choose from. Go through the list and circle the top ten that resonate most with you. Then narrow those down to five.
2. **Compare your values with your behavior.** Do you practice what you say? Do your values align with where you spend your time and money?

3. **Explore ways to live your purpose.** Try an activity related to a value. Then reflect on it and see if you or others got anything out of it and if you connected with others. If not, try something else.—It is a myth that happiness is a constant state. It will ebb and flow—up days and down days—but these can be part of a life in which you feel an overall sense of joy and contentment. Purpose is the same—good days and bad. Do your best, make your contribution, and keep others in mind.

PURPOSE IN ORGANIZATIONS:

Having a purpose in organizations is as important as having a purpose in life. It can provide direction, motivation, and meaning for members of the group or organization and attract others who share the same values. A clear purpose can also positively impact society and the environment, making the organization more resilient and adaptable to changes. One study found that purpose-driven organizations with a clear purpose were more likely to innovate, collaborate, and positively impact society. Whether you are a business, community organization, public entity, or church, having a purpose gives all individuals within their own built-in purpose to focus on. Groups without an identified purpose seem to have focal points all over the place, do a lot of talking, and not a lot of getting things done.

For organizations and groups to gain a purpose they need to:

1. **Make a mission statement.**
2. **Make a vision statement.**
3. **Organize and have a system in place that follows the group through the years.** The biggest waste of time for a group is when each year or two discussion is wasted on reorganizing and going over the past to try to “catch up”. If a system is in place, this does not need to happen and things can progress quicker. This also leads to less unneeded discussion and arguments within the group. Your focus is strong and guides you.
4. **Stay organized and focused.** When you have meetings, set an agenda and time limit, and stick to it. You will be amazed at what can actually get done.
5. **Stay focused within discussions.** If what you have to say isn't short, easily understand, and contributes to the end goal or solution to the problem, it doesn't need to be said. If you are simply putting words to things in your mind, or talking to hear yourself, stop and think about it. If it doesn't move anything to the solution or end goal, just push it aside and listen to

those around you until you can add something that moves to the focus and goal.

What is my purpose? My purpose moves around a bit through the years—but has remained steadfast and focused on God and what he has put me here for. It is to help others. If everything I think and do stays focused on that purpose of helping others, then no matter if I am working, going to church, or writing this newsletter, I am moving toward that positive purpose. It means my purpose doesn't rely on my job or any specific person. It also means I am not relying on myself, because I will let myself down, and that leads to anxiety and depression. I'm far from perfect, but this purpose has held true and strong for me for 15 years so far, and I will stay focused on that purpose for as long as I am here on earth.
